At Embers, we create a warm and welcoming environment where children can have fun, feel valued, and develop the confidence to become resilient, lifelong learners, ready for the 21st century.

Our community is dedicated to helping children grow in all aspects of life, allowing them to experience joy, wonder, and a true sense of belonging.

Children at Embers learn through rich and diverse experiences that are centered around their interests. Whether through curiosity-driven exploration, intentional play, or time spent in nature, we aim to help them develop skills and create memories that will last a lifetime.

With the support of caring adults and their peers, children engage in crosscurricular, project-based activities. They are encouraged to follow their passions, take ownership of their learning, and express themselves in creative and imaginative ways.



3 OUR APPROACH

At Embers, our approach shapes every moment of our day together, creating an environment where self-directed learning thrives. By focusing on the whole child—mind, body, and spirit—we design our days to encourage curiosity and exploration.

Each day is guided by five key areas: mind, body, spirit, environment, and community. This structure allows for a seamless blend of adult-guided activities and child-initiated exploration, ensuring that children have the freedom to follow their interests while also being supported in their growth.

For example, children may choose to immerse themselves in activities like reading, journaling, or experimenting, nurturing their minds. They might decide to move their bodies through yoga, sports, or dance. Their spirits are uplifted through music, creative arts, and meaningful discussions. Our environment is shaped by the children themselves as they engage in gardening, cooking, and creating inviting spaces. And, throughout it all, a sense of community is fostered through cooperative games, shared stories, and group reflections.

At Embers, our approach doesn't just guide what we do; it deeply influences how we do it. By creating a balance between structure and freedom, we support each child's natural love for learning, making every day a meaningful experience.



4 SHARING DAY

Celebration is a key part of our learning community. We believe in taking time to celebrate what matters to each of us—our achievements, our progress, and the journey we've shared together.

At the end of each term, we come together for Sharing Day, a special event where we gather as a community to share food and celebrate all the amazing work we've done. Sharing Day can take many forms, including exhibitions, performances, music, film screenings, artwork displays, and even running a café. The children take the lead in planning, preparing, and hosting these events, with guidance from our facilitators.

Our aim at Embers is to have children leave us with a thirst for learning, exploration and investigation.


The self confidence to ask questions and challenge ideas.

6 A DAY AT EMBERS

At Embers, each day flows naturally, guided by our gentle rhythm. We have just two fixed times: Arrival at 10:00 am and Home Time at 3:30 pm.

Morning Arrival:

Settle in and start exploring.

Morning Circle:

Gather to share news, plan the day, and enjoy a snack.

Project Time:

Continued work on our chosen projects.

Tidy Away:

Help clean up and get ready for the afternoon.

Lunch:

Enjoy a packed lunch, followed by time to play, explore, and rest inside and outside.

Workshops:

Join in on creative and educational workshops.

Tidy Away:

Get ready for the end of the day.

Afternoon Circle:

Share and reflect on the day's experiences.

Home Time:

Say goodbye and head home.

Our flexible rhythm allows children to deeply engage in activities, rest, and play as needed.

Please bring a packed lunch, snack, and drink for your child. Warm layers, cosy slippers, and weatherappropriate clothing are also important.

Our caring team of Lead and Support Learning Facilitators, all DBS checked and first aid trained, are here to provide a safe and enriching experience.



7 FEES



Registration Fee- £50 which secures an offered place at Embers.

Per Session-£43*
Fees will be paid in 12 monthly instalments of £139.75 This is based on one child, one day a week.

There will be a 10% discount applied to all siblings after the first child.





Embers is registered with Ofsted, which means that we can accept payment via Childcare Vouchers or If you are in receipt of Universal Credit or Tax Credits you maybe entitled to claim back up to 85% of the fees.

8 COMMUNITY DETAILS

Embers Learning Community is created by Home Educators for Home Educating Children aged 5-14 years old.

We are based in the pretty villages of Copythorne & Bransgore both situated in The New Forest.





Children can attend up to 2 days at Embers to supplement their home educating journey; unlike a school, the responsibility of the child's education remains with the parents or carers.

The day starts at 10.00am & finishes at 3.30pm. We follow the Hampshire school terms, running 39 weeks a year.

Embers Copythorne

At Embers Copythorne we run on Tuesdays & Thursdays. Copythorne is within easy access from Bournemouth, Southampton, Winchester, New Forest, Totton, The Waterside, Romsey & Salisbury.

Our community is set on 3 acres of private land, with 1 main indoor learning space & 2 break away spaces, a large kitchen and plenty of onsite parking. We also run our Forest Preschool from this site, perfect for the younger children.










Embers Bransgore

At Embers Bransgore we run on Tuesdays & Wednesdays. Bransgore is within easy access from Bournemouth, New Forest, Christchurch, Wimborne, Ferndown & Ringwood.

Our community is set on 3 acres of private land, with a large indoor learning space, kitchen, private woodland with direct access to The New Forest National Park & plenty of onsite parking. We also run our Forest Preschool & Nursery 10 minutes from this site, perfect for the younger children.









9 REGISTRATION

If you'd like to join us at Embers, please email us at embers@theoutdoorlearningcompany.co.uk to start the process.

To maintain a good mix of ages each day, we may have limited spaces available for different age groups. We embrace diversity and strive to support all homeeducated children who wish to attend Embers. We will do our best to accommodate each child's needs, but group facilitators may need to turn down a place if they feel they cannot provide the necessary support.

We offer a free trial session to help everyone see if Embers is a good fit. If the trial goes well for the child, parents/carers, and our facilitators, we'll set up a monthly payment schedule. If we can offer your child a spot, a non-refundable registration fee of £50 will be required to secure it. Please note that if you decide to withdraw, we ask for a four-week notice period. Our Lead Learning Facilitators are always available to provide feedback at drop-off or pick-up each week.

Growing up within a group of mixed aged children who all have such vastly different ideas and interests is how excitement and enthusiasm for new passions is sparked. My oldest home educated child is 15 and we've never been in school. My aim for the past 15 years was to inspire my children but also respond to their interests as quickly and actively as possible. I wanted them to be able to run with their passions and ideas, with a caring facilitator at their side guiding them along. Having multiple children and much younger siblings often makes that hard and I found frustration mounting for both my children and myself. Joining Embers meant welcoming in a team to my Home Ed journey that had the same ethos as me but all the time and resources I didn't to help me achieve my goal. My child comes home every week inspired. They work on their own ideas but are introduced to so many others that the whole family's life is richer for it. Sometimes you have an idea in your head of how Home Ed can be, the Embers team has made mine possible."
